THE GREAT SHAKEOUT OCTOBER 20, 2016

Millions of people worldwide will practice how to Drop, Cover and Hold on during the Great Shakeout Earthquake Drill on October 20, 2016. Participation is

a great way for your family or organizations to be prepared and survive and recover quickly from big earthquakes — wherever you live, work, or travel. ShakeOut is a major activity of America's PreparAthon!

You cannot tell from the initial shaking if an earthquake will suddenly become intense...so always:

- **DROP** to the ground (before the earthquake drops you!),
- COVER your head and neck with your arms and seek shelter by getting under a sturdy desk or table if nearby; and
- **HOLD ON** to your shelter and be prepared to move with it until the shaking stops.

PET CORNER

Please be a responsible pet owner and walk your dog on a leash always pick up after your pet.

If you witness a pet owner not cleaning up after their animal or

allowing their dog off of leash, please advise management of the violator. Please provide the address and any other helpful details (description of the dog, date, time, etc.). With this detailed information, the Board will be able to contact the violating party and enforce the pet policy.

WHAT ATTRACTS RODENTS?

Rodents are a threat to our health; dead or alive they spread disease. About the only way you can try to eliminate or keep a population explosion down is to remove their shelter and food source. We need to control what ATTRACTS them.

Shelter: With the cooler weather, rodent activity often increases as they are trying to find shelter and warmth. Please keep your vines and plants trimmed back and off of the buildings as this gives them a pathway to the roofs and attics.

Food Source: Vermin will eat almost anything they can get. They love open rubbish bins; dog and cat food left out in patio areas, composting material of any kind and will even eat animal feces (no joke). A rodent needs only 1 oz. of water to survive a day.

A female rat can mate within 18 hours of giving birth and can have 8 or more litters a year! With a gestation period of only 20-22 days and a litter average of 7-11 rats we have our work cut out for us.

PREPARING FOR WILDFIRES

Plan for Evacuation

- Plan your escape in advance. Be aware as to what you will "pack up and get out" if your home is in the path of a wildfire.
- Make a list of important items to take with you; including valuables, family photographs and videos, and important documents like insurance papers, birth certificates, and other legal papers. Be ready to take prescription medication, eyeglasses, and other health needs. Set up a plan for family members to reunite if separated.
- If you have them, include family pets and livestock in your plan and have a supply of food and water ready, as well as leashes, carriers and trailers if needed. Shot records and other documents may come in handy if boarding s required.
